


# PRESIDENT'S WELCOME



### NEW MEMBER ORIENTATION

New member orientation will be held in Ballroom South A, Sunday November 5, 4-6 p.m. Opening remarks by Robert Board, PACRAO Vice President, will be followed by greetings from the AACRAO President, Al Clary. New members will learn more about PACRAO, its relationship with AACRAO, and the professional concerns and needs of AACRAO from Stan Berry, who is a past president of both PACRAO and AACRAO. Mildred Scott, the immediate past president of PACROA, will share some ideas on what PACRAO can do for its members and what PACRAO can do for AACRAO. A question and answer period will follow. PACRAO President Gene Omey will provide the hospitality.



### PACRAO 78 OPENS WITH DAUGHERTY SPEECH

The opening session on Sunday evening, November 5, will be highlighted by an address from Dr. Richard D. Daugherty, professor of anthropology and director of the Washington Archaeological Research Center at Washington State University. Dr. Daugherty, one of the nation's foremost archaeologists, will speak on "Early Man In Washington."

He was Director of Excavations at the famous Marmes Rockshelter on the Palouse River in 1962, and since 1970 has directed excavations at the Ozette Archaeological site — often called "Pompeii of the Western World" — at Cape Alava on the Northwest Washington coast.

He was a nominee for president of the Society for American Archaeology in 1975, and in 1977 was named "Outstanding Scientist" by the Northwest Scientific Association.

A native Washingtonian, Daugherty attended Central Washington University and finished his undergraduate work at the University of Washington. He later earned the Ph.D. from the U of W.

Daugherty probably knows the archaeological history of the state of Washington better than anyone. In 1947 he conducted an archaeological survey of the entire coastal area of Washington and also surveyed 14 reservoir areas in Washington, Idaho and Montana for the Smithsonian Institution. Since that time he has opened up numerous excavation sites in the Pacific Northwest.

A member of the faculty at WSU since 1950, Daugherty served as Chairman of the Department of Anthropology and has been Director of the Washington Archaeological Research Center at the University since its establishment here in 1972.

In 1971, Daugherty was the recipient of "The Governor's Arts Award" presented by the Washington State Arts Commission (with the Makah Nation). He and noted Tacoma journalist-author Ruth Kirk won the first place award for "Hunters of the Whale" as the best science book ages 7-14 by the New York Academy of Sciences in 1974.

### BUSTAD FEATURED AT PRESIDENT'S LUNCHEON

Dr. Leo K. Bustad, Dean of the College of Veterinary Medicine at Washington State University will speak on "How To Listen and Who To Listen To" at the President's luncheon on Monday, November 6.

Dr. Bustad holds three degrees from WSU and received his Ph.D. in physiology from the University of Washington School of Medicine. In 1958 he was a National Science Foundation postdoctoral fellow there.

Dr. Bustad holds or has held committee assignments and council positions in many national organizations, both governmental and private. He is presently a member of the National Advisory Committee for the University of Washington Regional Primate Center and Chairman of the Committee on Veterinary Medical Sciences of the National Academy of Sciences/National Research Council. He serves as a consultant to the Surgeon General of the U.S. Air Force. His community service has included terms as a member of the Board of Regents of California Lutheran College; of the Board of Directors for Holden Village, an international retreat center where he is also part-time scientist-in-residence and chairman of the Science Advisory Committee; of the Board of Governors of the Institute of Human Ecology.

He performed and directed radiation biologic research at Hanford Laboratories, Richland, Washington, from 1949 to 1965 and then served on the faculty of the University of California, Davis, until taking his present post at WSU in 1973.

Dean Bustad has authored or coauthored over 200 articles and reports on education, nutrition, radiation, cancer, laboratory animal medicine, and comparative medicine. He also has taught in schools of medicine, veterinary medicine, and environmental sciences on the subjects of radiation biology, cancer, physiology, gerontology, and bioenvironmental aspects of energy utilization. He frequently speaks on these and other subjects.

### **Dinner Theatre**



#### PRESIDENT-ELECT

Robert R. Board, Registrar of California State University, Fresno, since 1964, has served this year as vice president and as editor of the PACRAO News. Bob was general conference chairman for the 1975 Fresno conference and

exhibits chairman for the 1973 AACRAO meeting in Los Angeles. In addition, he chaired the exhibits for PACRAO at Yosemite and Tahoe and is presently a consultant on registration for AACRAO. Bob is a graduate of the University of Santa Clara. An active conservationist, he formed the Tehipite Chapter of the Sierra Club, and has served as a consultant to the National Park Service and the National Forest Service.

#### VICE-PRESIDENT-ELECT

Ronald J. Bowker is Registrar and Admissions Officer at the San Diego campus of the University of California. Ron is a graduate of Loyola University, Chicago, and California State University, Los Angeles. He served as general conference chair at the San Diego conference in 1976 and was involved in coordinating MODS seminars from the time of their development by AACRAO at Ft. Collins, Colorado. He has also been an active member of AACRAO, serving oncommittees and participating in numerous programs.

#### SECRETARY-ELECT

Ann Tremarillo has been the Director of Admissions and Records at the University of Alaska since 1973. Ann, a graduate of the University of Alaska, has been with the Admissions and Records Office for 21 years. She serves as the Alaska Reporting Officer on transfer credit practices to AACRAO.
