### **Our Story Matters, A Black Family in Arizona**



We are excited to announce Dr. Tani Sanchez as our Diversity Luncheon speaker for the annual conference. Dr. Sanchez will discuss the importance of oral traditions, personal family migrations, and local community research, along with what they can create -- critical insight, cultural critique, and new paths to freedom.

Dr. Sanchez is a Professor in the College of Humanities, Africana Studies, and has lectured in Tucson and other cities on Black history, racial representations in film, and on African American family history and genealogy. Her wideranging background in broadcast and written journalism as well as in public affairs has included overseas assignments in the U.S. Army and a stint in the Arizona National Guard. Her academic writings have been published in two anthologies; she has created political videos and has written and edited books and newsletters for community-based associations.

# Diversity Development Book Club: We Should All Be Feminists



At this year's annual conference, the Diversity Development Committee will be hosting an interactive book club session that you will not want to miss! # **Remembering Tucson and Bob Bontrager**

As we head through summer and into fall, all PACRAO eyes turn to our upcoming conference in Tucson at the Westin La Paloma Resort and Spa. That resort is the same property where PACRAO's 78th Annual Conference was held in November 2004. Our theme that year was "Exploring New Educational Frontiers" and Bob Bontrager, then Associate Provost for Enrollment Management at Oregon State University, served as our PACRAO President.



I have many memories of that conference; one in particular was that, due to a clause in our contract, we had to spend a boatload on reception food, which made eating dinner afterward seriously unnecessary! Our gala that year was off-site at the Savoy Opera House in Old Town Tucson. A fun time was had by all.

Speaking of Bob Bontrager, through the years he inspired many young professionals to serve in our Oregon and Pacific Associations, leading by example by serving in many roles. He began his professional involvement in 1983 and was a "serial presenter" at state, regional and national conferences. In addition to many committee roles over the years, Bob served as the President of OrACRAO in 1999-2000; he served on the AACRAO 2000 Taskforce, AACRAO's Financial Aid Committee, and AACRAO's Enrollment Management Committee. After leaving Oregon State, he was the Senior Director of AACRAO Consulting and SEM Initiatives. He authored several SEM books including The Handbook of Strategic Enrollment Management with co-author Don Hossler, and numerous other SEM articles and book chapters. He served as the leader of AACRAO's SEM conference for many years.

Bob had a big smile for everyone and was a true giver. Sadly, Bob died of cancer at the young age of 57 on October 17, 2014. We honor Bob and others as we look ahead to Tucson to gather together again in celebration of our profession and each other.

The exemplary new member award may be given to individuals who have made significant contributions to PACRAO and to the membership in their first years as a member. In both cases, the past president solicits nominations from the membership and forwards names to the executive board for consideration.

Nominations are due by September 30, 2021. You can submit nominations by clicking <u>here</u> to submit one or more names for the awards and recognition listed above. Please consider nominated someone you know to be an active member of PACRAO so they can be recognized for the amazing work they do.

### **Conference Participation Grants**

The PACRAO Professional Development Committee is pleased to announce an update: We now have 10 Conference Participation Grants for the 2021 Annual Conference available. The grants are for in-person attendance and cover the conference registration fee for PACRAO's annual conference at The Westin La Paloma Resort, Tucson, Arizona occurring October 31 - November 3, 2021.

Special consideration is given to applicants who are first-time attendees, persons from under-represented groups or institution types, and members of institutions whose funds are especially limited. Individuals who have previously received the grant will not be considered.

To apply, the individual needs to be employed by an institution that is a current member of PACRAO, and the individual needs to be listed in that institution's roster of members.

Deadline to apply: August 31st, 2021

How to apply: Submit application by email to Laura Remillard at <u>vp-pd@pacrao.org</u>.

Send a one-page written proposal, with the following information:

1. Applicant's name, title, office or department, institution, address, phone, and email

2. Reasons for applying a conference participation grant

3. Include if a first-time attendee, person from under-represented groups or institution types, or member of institutions whose funds are especially limited

4. Submit a letter of support from the applicant's supervisor and/or from another PACRAO member outlining the benefits of awarding a grant to the applicant.
